Service Time changes - from Sunday October 2nd.

The PCC met on Tuesday evening to make a final decision about changes in service times to allow one priest to cover all the Sunday services in the parish. One person covering all three services won't always be necessary but it will make sick and holiday cover easier and relieve the pressure on a diminishing number of clergy across the Team Ministry.

The new pattern of Sunday Services will be:

- 8am Holy Eucharist, St Mary's
- 9.30am Sung Eucharist, St Mary's
- 11.15am Sung Eucharist, St Paul's

On the **First Sunday** of the month, starting in October for Harvest Festival (and replacing the trial 11.30am and 2pm Cafe church experiment), the pattern of services for the rest of this year will be:

- St Mary's
- 8am Holy Eucharist, Book of Common Prayer
(traditional language service)
- 9.30am Communion for All God's Family
- St Paul's
- 11.15am All God's Family Service
(Non-Eucharistic)
